

LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT



Dear Friends,

Peace Be Upon You.

Projects for Humanity (P4H) was founded in September, 2017 to provide relief through various unique humanitarian aid projects. As a donor to many non-profits along the years, I would wonder sometimes exactly how funds were being allocated to the needy. Therefore, as a non-profit in the relief and development sector, we are holding ourselves to a high standard of transparency. While it is standard practice for organizations to produce an annual report each year, we hope this bi-annual report will increase our transparency and provide more updates on the work you all make possible.

With the spread of Covid-19 globally, it has been a time of a lot of uncertainty and fear. P4H cares for people as it is the core of what we do. It is during times like these that we work harder to support our communities and the less fortunate. Our main focus became emergency covid-19 response projects. These are the numerous ways P4H acted with immediate response:

- increased public awareness about social distancing, hand washing, and mask protection;
- provided personal protective equipment to hospitals;
- disburse soap and hand sanitizers to the needy;
- distributed food boxes and cash to needy families who were affected by the shutdown;
- held free food bazaars in communities; and
- gave grants for necessary bills to families with hardship

Not only was the pandemic an issue threatening people's health, the Cyclone Amphan added difficulty to people's livelihood. Again, P4H allocated emergency resources with the generosity of donors to distribute emergency food baskets and assist in rebuilding homes. On top of natural disaster relief, P4H's on-going projects such as Complete Orphan care, Minute Clinic, Rohingya refugee assistance, Underprivileged empowerment, and Education Scholarships to poor students continued to expand.

In the first half of 2020, P4H reached a new milestone – an increased revenue of over 350%. This growth was possible due to supportive donors and the hard work of P4H's team in expanding our outreach while strengthening our programs and services. It wasn't always easy. P4H has adjusted its processes to be more efficient and made hard decision to help as many people as we can. We continue to ask more from our supporters because the results of all that effort are undeniable. Thank you for your continued support.

DISASTER RELIEF 1

COVID-19 EMERGENCY RESPONSE COMPLETED

Public Awareness

📍 Jessore and Chapai Nababgonj, Bangladesh

📅 March, 2020

What we did?

Create public awareness through announcements, posters, and flyers about social distancing, hand-washing, and the benefits of wearing a mask in order to protect from COVID-19.

Why we did it?

Novel coronavirus caseloads continue to surge across the world. To date, 8.8 million people are affected and 440 thousand people died due to COVID-19. The CDC provided some guidelines to avoid spreading this disease. Both developing and developed countries are failing to maintain these guidelines. Especially rural people of Bangladesh do not have any knowledge about this. Therefore, P4H created awareness of CDC guidelines using their local language, so that they may understand.

Accomplishment

About 200,000 people received the CDC guidelines and awareness about coronavirus so that they may take necessary precautions to prevent further spread of this virus and protect themselves.

COVID-19 EMERGENCY RESPONSE COMPLETED

Hygiene Kit Distribution

📍 Jessore and Chapai Nababgonj, Bangladesh

📅 March, 2020

What we did?

We distributed soap and hand sanitizers to needy people when people were desperately in need of this in the end of March 2020.

Why we did it?

One of the uniqueness of this dangerous coronavirus is that it spreads very fast. The CDC advised to wash hands frequently, use hand sanitizer, and masks. However, it's difficult for the poor people of Bangladesh to get these things when their struggle is to feed themselves.

Accomplishment

P4H distributed 1500 soap and 800 hand sanitizers to the local people at a time when it was scarce in many locations, due to high demand.

COVID-19 EMERGENCY RESPONSE COMPLETED

Complete PPEs Distribution

📍 Distributed to 8 different Hospitals in Dhaka, Cox's Bazar and Bogura

📅 March, 2020

450 PPEs

What we did?

We distributed complete Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) including gowns, headcover, goggles, facemask, hand gloves, foot cover to hospitals at a time when doctors and health care professionals could not treat people due to the lack of PPEs.

Accomplishment

450 Complete PPE were distributed to doctors and frontline workers in March when there was a shortage, allowing them to provide treatment to patients during this critical time.

Why we did it?

When coronavirus hit mid-March in Bangladesh, hospitals and healthcare professionals refused to provide treatment to their patients with any symptoms that match with coronavirus because the hospitals did not have adequate PPE. Therefore, according to a local newspaper thousands of patients died without proper treatment even if they are not affected by coronavirus. P4H acted quickly and distributed complete PPEs to hospitals.

COVID-19 EMERGENCY RESPONSE COMPLETED

Food Basket Distribution

📍 Dhaka, Chapai Nababgonj, Cox's Bazar, Jessore, Sirajgonj, Mymensingh, Comilla, Noakhali, Thakurgaon, Kurigram, and Rangpur

📅 March-May, 2020

1200 food packages (432,000 meals)

What we did?

As part of Ramadan Food Basket and COVID-19 relief, we distributed food packages to the needy families in different locations. A package of food is sufficient for a family with 4 members for a month. This includes rice, lentils, potatoes, onions, oil, salt, chickpeas, sugar, dates, puffed rice etc.

Why we did it?

The Bangladesh government imposed lockdown as in other countries. But day laborers, people who lived hand to mouth faced another problem; they did not have food to eat. According to a local newspaper, 14% of the population do not have any food to eat. But the situation was worse than this according to our local team.

Accomplishment

P4H distributed the foods to those families who faced hardship due to the lockdown, and the inability to work, so that can survive for a month without having to worry about where their next meal would come from.

COVID-19 EMERGENCY RESPONSE

COMPLETED

Free Food Bazar

📍 Jessore and Cox's Bazar, Bangladesh

📅 May, 2020

What we did?

Anyone who was in need of food, no questions asked, could come and take necessary food items such as rice, lentils, potatoes, oil, and onions by themselves from our free food bazar.

Why we did it?

Due to the lockdown, low income level people were struggling to make ends meet and provide for their families. At the same time, they felt shy and embarrassed to get relief from others. This free food market created a comfortable way for them to get food. In this bazar anybody could come anytime and get anything they wanted, without having to ask anybody. This project was appreciated in the local communities and by social media.

COVID-19 EMERGENCY RESPONSE

Cash/Grant in Bangladesh

📍 More than 20 districts in Bangladesh

What we did?

We distributed cash to COVID-19 affected people in our "Chader Hashi" project in partnership with Prothom Alo Bondhusova.

Accomplishment

P4H provided cash assistance to day laborers who could not work during the lockdown and COVID-19 situation. This benefitted 200 poor families in partnership with Prothom Alo Bondhusova and 100 families by P4H alone.

Why we did it?

Due to the lockdown, day laborers did not have any income. In some cases they received aid relief for their meals, but they needed to buy necessities such as medicine, milk for their baby, or sanitary items. They did not have any money to buy these necessities.

Cash/Grant in USA

USA

What we did?

We provided grants to COVID-19 affected people in the US.

Accomplishment

P4H has provided gas, utilities and electricity bills for 3 months benefitting 3 families who qualified for this grant so far.

3 families, 3 months bills paid

Why we did it?

38.5 million of people lost jobs due to COVID-19 in the US. The US government has issued a one-time stimulus check in the amount of \$1,200 to the American people as a form of aid. However, it has left many who lived paycheck to paycheck with not enough to even buy food and pay rent, when they could not work for an extended period of time. Many non-profit organizations came forward to help the COVID-19 affected people. P4H provided grants to COVID-19 affected people to pay their bills for a few months.



CYCLONE AMPHAN MERGYENCY RESPONSE

ONGOING

Food Basket Distribution

Khulna and Bhaagerhaat, Bangladesh

What we did?

We distributed emergency food baskets to people affected by Cyclone Amphan.

Accomplishment

P4H distributed 1 month of food packages in severely affected areas benefitting 90 families.

Why we did it?

Cyclone Amphan, the worst of its kind in 25 years, has left behind a trail of destruction in the country's coastal areas, affecting more than a million people in nine districts in Khulna and Barisal divisions. Low-lying areas of southern districts are flooded and people became homeless as their houses were submerged in water, wiped out or devastated by the storm. Many trees and houses were destroyed along with the embankment due to the cyclonic storm.

According to officials, "The cyclone destroyed standing crops, vegetables and fruits on 1.76 lakh acres of land, uprooted millions of trees and damaged fish farms. More than 200 bridges and culverts and thousands of houses were damaged in the coastal districts."

CYCLONE AMPHAN EMERGENCY RESPONSE ONGOING

Amphan Rehabilitation

📍 Satkhira, Khulna and Bhaagerhaat, Bangladesh

20 houses, 20 families

📅 December, 2020

What we did?

We are working on rehabilitation of houses affected by the cyclone.

Why we did it?

Cyclone Amphan, the worst of its kind in 25 years, has left behind a trail of destruction in the country's coastal areas, affecting more than a million people in nine districts in Khulna and Barisal divisions. Low-lying areas of southern districts are flooded and people became homeless as their houses are submerged in water, wiped out or devastated by the storm. Many trees and houses are destroyed along with the embankment due to the cyclonic storm.

According to the officials, "The cyclone destroyed standing crops, vegetables and fruits on 1.76 lakh hectares of land, uprooted millions of trees and damaged fish farms. More than 200 bridges and culverts and thousands of houses were damaged in the coastal districts."

Accomplishment

20 families will have a peace of mind, to have a home and safe-haven they can reside in that was destroyed by the devastating cyclone.

COMPLETE ORPHAN CARE 2

ORPHAN CARE ONGOING

📍 Bangladesh

20 Orphans

What we did?


Poor orphans in our complete care of orphans program receive lodging, meals, clothes, education and healthcare.

Accomplishment

20 orphans in our program have a safe place to stay, enjoy warm cooked meals, receive new clothes, along with care of their health. Furthermore, our orphans are doing well in their education, performing at the top 10% in their classes.

Why we did it?

An estimated 153 million children worldwide are orphans (UNICEF), while an estimated 5,700 more children become orphans everyday. A child does not become an orphan by choice but instead due to unfortunate circumstances. Orphans are the roses of our society. If we take care of our rose buds, they will blossom into beautiful roses.

FREE MEDICAL TREATMENT 3

MINUTE CLINIC ONGOING

📍 Chapai Nababgonj, Bangladesh

What we did?

Once a month, P4H Minute Clinic opens to the public to provide free medical treatment in a rural part of Bangladesh. An internal medicine doctor provides various medical treatments such as check-ups to families, special screenings for diabetes and blood pressure for the elderly, physical therapy and advice on arthritis and back pain, immunizations, medicines, and referrals to specialist doctors in cases of severe illness.

Accomplishment

We served 300 people from January to March to get free medical checkup and treatment. Minute clinic is currently closed due to COVID-19, it will resume once the situation becomes normal.

Why we did it?

According to International Journal for Equity in Health, 15% people of Bangladesh do not receive medical treatment. According to the World Health Organization (WHO), health services are concentrated in urban areas, although 70% of the population live in rural areas. Therefore, people in rural areas lack access to health care. We believe getting treatment is a human right; therefore, we are providing free treatment in the rural area.

REFUGEE ASSISTANCE - ROHINGYA 4

CONSTRUCTION OF WATER WELL, KITCHEN AND AN ORPHAN SHELTER COMPLETED

📍 Unchiprang Camp-22 Teknaf,
Cox's Bazar

📅 March, 2020

What we did?

We have constructed a new kitchen building and built a water well with multiple facets and a water storage tank that will allow preparation of food to feed 2500 children.

Also we have constructed an orphan center to house 50 orphans.

Why we did it?

The United Nations described the Rohingya people of Burma as one of the most persecuted communities in the world, and called it a "textbook example of ethnic cleansing". The United States called this a graveous genocide and passed a resolution in the house of congress to stop this genocide.

More than 2 million Rohingya fled from Myanmar to save their lives. According to numerous reports, 1.6 million Rohingya and 50 thousand orphans have been living in the neighboring country, Bangladesh. They are living miserable lives at some handful number of slums in Cox's Bazar.

2500 orphans will get food from the kitchen and water from the water well. Also, 50 orphans will have a shelter to reside in.

What we did?

The construction for the playground is underway.

Accomplishment

500 Rohingya children will enjoy their childhood through this playground so they can temporarily escape their families' hardships.

UNDERPRIVILEGED EMPOWERMENT 5

LIVESTOCK DISTRIBUTION COMPLETED

📍 Chapai Nababgonj, Bangladesh

📅 February, 2020

What we did?

Six cows distributed to poverty-stricken families, widows, and elderly people who can take care of the cow to help generate income.

Accomplishment

Cow distribution benefitted 6 families. Each family needs approximately 30-40 thousand taka to lead their family in a year. With a cow each family will get 40-50 thousand taka in a year, which will allow them to no longer beg from others.

Why we did it?

According to ADP, in Bangladesh, 21.8% of the population are living below the national poverty line in 2018. Especially in the rural area, the poor people do not have a means to earn money and they must beg to get just a meal.

SCHOLARSHIP TO MERITORIOUS STUDENTS ONGOING

📍 Bangladesh

3 students

What we did?

Scholarship to three new students this year.

Why we did it?

There are so many poor students especially from remote rural areas of Bangladesh who are talented and meritorious but unable to continue their studies due to financial hardship. If we provide a little assistance they will be the future leaders of our society.

Accomplishment

Three students received merit scholarships from P4H to help continue their studies that otherwise would not be possible due to poverty condition of their family. Two of the students received britti: one in class 8 and another in class 5. Britti in Bangladesh is considered the highest level of accomplishment in the class.

What we did?

We arranged an appreciation Iftar where we thanked them for their hard work during this challenging time COVID-19.

Why we did it?


What we did?
