LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT ///

Dear friends, donors, volunteers & well-wishers,

The year **2020** was the most challenging year in the human history across the globe. The unprecedented events of **2020** have tested the resiliency of mankind in so many ways. The **COVID-19** pandemic led to **40** million Americans filing for unemployment and **115** million people across the world being driven into extreme poverty. Particularly in Bangladesh where **59%** of population were day laborers whose income totally were stopped due to **COVID-19** locked down, hence **14%** of people did not have a next meal to eat. It also made it harder to deal with every other critical issue, which included devastating cyclone Amphan, and record low winter storm etc. both in USA and Bangladesh. Refugee and orphan communities worldwide became more vulnerable in this year.

During this pandemic, we also witnessed the unwavering spirit of our donors who rushed to aid the helpless. This noble and selfless quality was praised by God. With all of your generosity, **Projects for Humanity (P4H)** had a very successful year and grew by over **354%** compared to the previous year.

To tackle pandemic, our main focus became emergency **covid-19** response projects which included but not limited to public awareness of **covid-19** safety & precautions, complete PPEs distribution to the front liners, soap, hand sanitizers & masks distribution to the needy, distribution of free food bazar, food boxes, cash and **covid-19** grant to pandemic affected people.

Again, **P4H** allocated emergency resources with the generosity of donors to distribute emergency food baskets and assist in rebuilding homes for cyclone Amphan affected people. On top of natural disaster relief, **P4H's** on-going projects such as Complete Orphan care, Minute Clinic, Rohingya refugee assistance, Underprivileged empowerment, and Education Scholarships to poor students continued to expand.

Our core values are transparency, accountability and donor satisfaction. To attain our core values, we would like to provide open access to our team. 
About Projects for Humanity (P4H)




Cyclone Amphan Emergency Response

Cyclone Amphan devastated coastal area including 9 districts in Khulna and Barisal divisions of Bangladesh. Millions of people were rendered homeless as their houses submerged in water, and/or wiped out by the storm completely. P4H reconstructed 20 houses that benefitted 26 families. Our volunteers distributed 200 food baskets worth of 72,000 meals travelling by boats to the most remote of the Amphan affected areas.

COVID-19 Emergency Response

The **COVID-19** pandemic resulted in unprecedented loss of human lives, stalled economic activities, put millions of people under poverty line and brought hunger to the center stage, particularly in the under-developed or developing countries such as Bangladesh. **P4H** has been working since beginning of the pandemic with the communities to provide support in all these frontiers. We distributed complete personal protective equipments (PPEs) for doctors and nurses when it was most critical. we distributed soap and hand sanitizers to the public spaces of high traffic. During the countrywide lockdown to prevent further spread of **COVID-19**, we distributed food baskets with a month worth of groceries for daily wage earners in addition to distributing cash to cover their utility bills and medications. In the rural areas where public health awareness is low, **P4H** created awareness through posters, flyers, banners, and miking about **COVID-19** safety initiatives. We also spread the warmth during the harsh **COVID** winter by distributing blankets.

Complete Orphan Care

An estimated **153** million children worldwide are orphans (UNICEF), while an estimated **5,700** more children become orphans everyday. A child does not become an orphan by choice but instead due to unfortunate circumstances that befall them. Orphans are the roses of our society. If we take care of our rose buds, they will blossom into beautiful roses.

Therefore, **P4H** continues to provide complete care including lodging, meals, clothes, education, and healthcare in our orphan center. In **2020**, **P4H** launched its second orphan center in Mymensingh, Bangladesh

Accomplishment

P4H launched our second orphan center in Mymensingh, Bangladesh. **37** orphans in our program have a safe place to stay, enjoy warm cooked meals, receive new clothes, along with care of their health. Furthermore, our orphans are doing well in their education, performing at the top **10%** in their classes. **3** orphans received the sponsorship.

Accomplishment

We served **1000** people to get free medical check-up and treatment. About **3000** people received health awareness during COVID-19.

Free Medical Treatment

According to International Journal for Equity in Health, **15%** people of Bangladesh do not receive any medical treatment at all even when they dire-ly need it. According to the World Health Organization (WHO), health services are concentrated in the urban areas of the country, although **70%** of the population live in the rural areas. Therefore, **P4H** Minute Clinics open its door to the public to provide free medical treatment and create health awareness in some of the rural parts of Bangladesh. In the year **2020**, we at **P4H** started our second minute clinic in Kurigram, Bangladesh.

According to the Annual Development Plan (ADP) by the administrations in Bangladesh, **21.8%** of the population were living below the national poverty line in 2018. Especially in the rural area, the poor people do not have a means to earn money and often must beg to get just a meal. Here at **P4H** we beleive in sustainable development that raise people above the poverty lines.

Therefore, **P4H** provided income generating tools to those who need them the most. In 2020, we distributed **12** cattles, **5** water-wells, **20** sewing machines, and **4** autorickshaws. We helped establish **3** small business and distributed **3,30,000** BDT cash so that people can start a profession instead of begging on the streets.

Scholarship to Meritorious Students

There are so many poor students especially from remote rural areas of Bangladesh who are talented and meritorious but unable to continue their studies due to financial hardship. When provided a little assistance, they will be the future leaders of our society.

Therefore, P4H gave educational scholarship to 58 poor meritorious students during 2020.

Accomplishment

58 students received merit scholarships from P4H to help continue their studies that otherwise would not be possible due to poverty condition of their family. All of the students received britti: Britti in Bangladesh is considered the highest level of accomplishment in the class.

2500 orphans will get food from the kitchen and water from the water well. Also, 50 orphans will have a shelter to reside in.

Construction of water well, kitchen and an orphan shelter

More than 2 million Rohingya fled the ethnic cleansing and corresponding humanitarian crisis in Myanmar to save their lives and took shelter in the refugee camps in Cox's Bazar, Bangladesh. According to numerous reports, 1.6 million Rohingya and 50 thousand orphans have been living in these camps under extraordinarily difficult circumstances.

We have constructed a new kitchen building and built a water well with multiple facets and a water storage tank that will allow preparation of food to feed 2500 children.


Also we have constructed an orphan center to house 50 orphans.


Volunteer Appreciation Iftar


