P4H Qurbani Program for Rohingya People

Project Overview

What We Did

During the Muslim celebration of Eid al-Adha, we distributed fresh meat to extremely vulnerable families in selected locations across Bangladesh, including the Rohingya Refugee Camp in Cox's Bazar through the provision of Qurbani meat.

Why we Did

Eid al-Adha is one of the biggest celebrations for Muslims all around the world. They observe this through completing Hajj, the annual pilgrimage to Mecca and the sacrificial slaughter of animals, known as Qurbani, to honour the willingness of Prophet Ibrahim (PBUH) to sacrifice his son, Ismail (PBUH). Muslims who can afford the sacrifice of Qurbani exploit this chance to cater to feed the needy people with the meat of slaughtered animals. Projects for Humanity is committed to making the Islamic duty of Qurbani accessible and beneficial for everyone involved. The celebration of Qurbani in Bangladesh is impactful because 14 percent of the population do not have their next meal to eat due to poverty.

About 15.1% of its population does not have enough to meet their minimum daily diets. The data of Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) shows that only 4.0 kg of meat are consumed by a typical person in a typical year. This has made Bangladesh one of the least meat-eating countries on earth. In comparison, a US resident, the biggest consumer of animal flesh, consumes 120.2 kg of meat in a typical year, a staggering 30 times more than that of Bangladesh. Many recipients informed us that they hardly had any meat the whole year, which breaks our heart. Many people struggle to provide necessities such as food for their families. How can they celebrate Eid? Therefore, we provided fresh meat so they can get nutrition and enjoy their Eid al-Adha with their families without worrying about how they will pay for it.


Project Overview
