Wellness for All: Reaching Remote Corners with Compassion

PROJECT OVERVIEW

What we did

The Free Medical Treatment project aimed to improve healthcare access for underprivileged individuals in remote areas of Bangladesh. Throughout 2024, we conducted monthly campaigns in regions lacking medical facilities. An internal medicine doctor provided various services, including general checkups for families, specialized screenings for diabetes and blood pressure for the elderly, physical therapy and guidance on arthritis and back pain, immunizations, essential medications, and referrals to specialist doctors for severe cases. Additionally, we organized health awareness sessions to educate communities.


Projects for Humanity supports these vulnerable groups by providing essential medical care and health education. We ensure women receive reproductive healthcare and pregnant women get regular checkups, helping them lead healthier lives and strengthening community well-being.

Why we did it

According to the International Journal for Equity in Health, 15% of Bangladesh's population lacks access to medical treatment, and the World Health Organization (WHO) reports that most healthcare services are concentrated in urban areas, leaving rural regions underserved despite housing 70% of the population. Healthcare is a fundamental human right, and our initiative seeks to bridge this gap by providing free treatment to rural communities. We prioritize women's health, as many in remote areas silently suffer from reproductive issues without access to medical care, and maternal care, as pregnant women face childbirth complications due to the lack of regular checkups.

Where we did it

We conduct monthly free medical treatment campaigns in **Kurigram, Cumilla, Chapainawabganj, Jhenaidah, Dhaka, and Mymensingh** Bangladesh.



PROJECT OVERVIEW

January to December, 2024

We carried out this project throughout the entire year.

In the past 12 months, a total of **77 free medical campaigns** were conducted, benefiting more than 3,500 individuals.



Accomplishment

In 2024, our campaign made significant strides in improving community healthcare. A total of **3347 individuals**, including **1,294 men**, **1,302 women**, and **751 children**, received free medical treatment, while over 3,500 people benefited from our health awareness programs. We saw a notable increase in female patients seeking care, addressing gender disparities in healthcare access. Many individuals with chronic illnesses, who had been without proper care for years, experienced relief and recovery through our consistent support. This achievement highlights the transformative impact of our efforts.
