





### Why we did

Eid al-Adha is one of the most significant festivals for Muslims worldwide, yet many impoverished families in Bangladesh cannot afford Qurbani due to financial hardships. To support them, we distribute Ourbani meat to the most fresh vulnerable, who have limited access to meat throughout the year. Some families face such dire circumstances that they lack even the basic spices and ingredients to prepare a meal. To ensure they can truly enjoy Eid, we not only provide meat but also cook and deliver nourishing meals to their homes, bringing joy and dignity to those in need.

### Accomplishment

We distributed 146 Qurbani on Eid-ul-Azha 2023, benefiting +6,000 people in different districts of Bangladesh on behalf of our donors, delivering fresh meat to the most vulnerable. Additionally, we prepared and distributed cooked meals among the poor and unprivileged people.

Through our Orphan Scholarship Program, we ensure that no child's education or dreams are hindered by financial struggles, no matter where they are in Bangladesh.

### **Accomplishment**

In 2023, our healthcare campaign became a beacon of hope for thousands in need. We provided free medical treatment to 2,581 individuals—1,049 men, 1,143 women, and 389 children—while over 3,000 people gained vital health awareness. More women sought treatment, breaking barriers in healthcare access. For many with chronic illnesses, our services meant relief and renewed hope. These numbers reflect lives transformed and a healthier future we're building together.

### Why we did

In Bangladesh, 15% of people lack medical care, with rural communities facing the greatest challenges. Despite 70% living in rural areas, healthcare remains centered in cities, leaving millions underserved. Women in remote areas silently endure reproductive health issues, while many face lifethreatening childbirth complications due to the lack of checkups.

At Projects for Humanity, we believe healthcare is a basic human right. We provide free treatment in rural areas, ensuring the most vulnerable receive the care they need to lead healthier lives.

## Why we did it?

On April 4th, 2023, a devastating fire destroyed around 6,000 shops in the Bangabazar market, Dhaka, causing an estimated loss of 10 billion BDT and leaving traders, workers, and families without income. Many had purchased new stock for Ramadan, but the fire took away everything.

In response, we swiftly provided financial assistance to help those affected recover, rebuild, and restart their businesses. We stand in solidarity with the community, working together to restore livelihoods and create new opportunities.

### Accomplishment

We provided crucial aid to Bangabazar after the devastating fire, offering modest cash support to alleviate immediate burdens and express solidarity with affected individuals and businesses in their recovery. We offered financial aid to around 60 small and medium business owners and employees, providing them with BDT 20000 in cash.

### Why we did

In our Pure Water Project, we took significant steps to provide clean water to various regions in the country. We established water wells in different areas, ensuring access to safe and reliable water sources for local communities. Additionally, in this year, we set up a solarpowered Saline Water treatment plant at Nildumur at Shyamnagar upazila of Satkhira district to resolve the crisis of saline water in that region. Through these initiatives, we aimed to make a positive impact on people's lives by promoting access to pure and sustainable water resources.

### Accomplishment

In 2023, our 30 water wells brought clean drinking water to thousands of people across deprived communities in Bangladesh, reducing waterborne diseases and easing daily struggles. Our solar-powered water treatment plant in coastal Bangladesh now serves thousands of people daily with 5000 liters of pure drinking water, ensuring sustainable access to safe water.

#### RAMADAN FOOD BASKET

We distributed more than 100 food baskets to the Rohingya population residing in the refugee camp in Cox's Bazar. Each basket is designed to sustain a family of four for an entire month, containing essential provisions like rice, lentils, oil, onions, grams, sugar, and other necessities. The goal was to provide assistance to the vulnerable economically disadvantaged Rohingya community, particularly during the month of Ramadan.

#### **QURBANI**

On Eid-ul-Azha 2023, we slaughtered 15 goats at the Rohingya Refugee Camp in Cox's Bazar. The most disad-vantaged refugee population in the world. With utmost care, we distributed fresh meat to 200 families, aiming to bring joy and nourishment to those in need. Our mission was to spread happiness and uplift the spirits of these individuals, especially the chil- dren through the act of Ourbani.


