

As a long-time donor to various non-profits, I often wondered how effectively contributions were reaching those most in need. That concern inspired the foundation of P4H—with a promise of the highest level of transparency and accountability. While annual reports are common for organizations, we aim to go further—ensuring that our donors and well-wishers gain a clear understanding of the true impact their support is making in people's lives.

The year 2024 brought both challenges and blessings. Our beloved Bangladesh faced devastating floods, rising living costs, and deepening struggles among vulnerable communities. Yet, with your unwavering support, Projects for Humanity (P4H) stood strong—delivering hope, relief, and sustainable solutions.

This year, our projects touched tens of thousands of lives:

- ▼ 750 families received Ramadan food baskets.
- 2,500 families were blessed through Qurbani meat distribution across 9 districts.
- Over 3,500 patients were treated through free health camps.
- ▼ 55 orphans in our centers received full care—education, meals, health, and love.
- 2,000 people daily gained access to clean water through our Solar RO plants in Satkhira.
- 1,898 flood-affected families were rescued, rehabilitated, and supported with new homes, livelihoods, and education.
- Rohingya refugee children continued their education with zero dropouts.

Your generosity fuels this mission. Together, we are not just providing aid—we are restoring dignity, building futures, and changing lives.





## Why we did

Across Bangladesh, countless talented children from poor and rural families are forced to give up their education due to financial constraints. Many who could have become future leaders are held back by poverty.

P4H launched Champion Academy to break this cycle—offering full support, education, and opportunities to gifted students. We believe that by nurturing their talents, we are shaping future changemakers who will uplift society.

## **Accomplishment**

58 students, including 13 orphans, were supported with full residential care, nutritious meals, healthcare, and extracurricular activities through the Cheating Champions project. This initiative ensures they have the opportunities and care needed to thrive academically and beyond, breaking barriers and building a brighter future.

#### Why we did

Education is often a distant dream for underprivileged students struggling with financial hardship. Despite their talent and ambition, many are forced to drop out due to lack of resources.

P4H introduced its Scholarship Program to remove these barriers, empowering bright students to pursue education without interruption. Our mission is to ensure that financial struggles never become a reason to extinguish a child's potential.

## **Accomplishment**

In 2024, under our scholarship program, 30 students received recurring scholarships — 13 orphans and 17 underprivileged but talented students. In addition, 15 more orphan students received one-time scholarships as support during their most critical times.

This continued support helped remove financial barriers and provided the stability they needed to remain in school year after year. By easing the burden of educational expenses, these initiatives have empowered students to pursue their studies with confidence and determination, nurturing them to become future leaders who can contribute meaningfully to society.

#### Why we did

In the sacred month of Ramadan, people grappling with poverty frequently encounter challenges in securing nourishing Sehri and Iftar meals. Fasting and working under limited resources become a daunting challenge for them.

P4H was unwavering in its dedication to sharing the blessings of Ramadan among the less fortunate through focused initiatives. Our efforts ensured that struggling families could fast with dignity and joy, strengthening compassion within communities.

## Accomplishment

The Ramadan Food Basket Project provided essential sustenance to more than 6,370 individuals, ensuring meals throughout the holy month.

By distributing 900+ Ramadan Food Baskets, providing Suhr and Iftar packages to 300 individuals, delivering Zakat al-Fitr support to 311 families, and sharing joy with 300 new Eid dresses.

# Why we did

Eid al-Adha is one of the most sacred festivals for Muslims, yet countless impoverished families in Bangladesh cannot afford to perform Qurbani due to financial hardship. For many, meat is a rare luxury, and some even lack the basic ingredients to prepare a proper meal. To uphold the spirit of Eid. P4H distributed fresh Ourbani meat to the most vulnerable, ensuring that families who rarely taste meat could celebrate with dignity. In addition, cooked meals were prepared and delivered to those in greatest need, spreading joy, nourishment, and a sense of inclusion during this blessed occasion.

#### Accomplishment

On Eid-ul-Azha 2024, we successfully distributed 172 Qurbani sacrifices across various districts of Bangladesh, reaching over 12000 beneficiaries. With the generous support of our donors, fresh meat was delivered directly to the most vulnerable families. In addition, we prepared and served nutritious cooked meals to underprivileged communities, ensuring that even the poorest could celebrate Eid with dignity and nourishment.

#### Why we did

In Bangladesh, around 15% of people lack access to medical care, with rural communities bearing the greatest burden. Although nearly 70% of the population lives in rural areas, healthcare facilities remain concentrated in cities, leaving millions underserved. Women in particular suffer in silence—facing untreated reproductive health issues and life-threatening childbirth complications due to the absence of regular checkups.

At Projects for Humanity, we believe that healthcare is a basic human right. Through our free medical camps, we bring doctors, medicine, and health awareness directly to rural communities, ensuring that the most vulnerable receive the care they need to live healthier, dignified lives.

#### Accomplishment

In 2024, P4H organized 77 free medical camps across 6 districts, reaching 3,573 patients including 1,294 men, 1,302 women, and 751 children-while more than 4,000 people gained vital health awareness. We witnessed a notable rise in women seeking treatment, helping to reduce aender disparities in healthcare access. For many suffering from chronic illnesses without proper care for years, our support brought relief, recovery, and renewed hope. This achievement reflects the transformative impact of accessible healthcare and the brighter, healthier future we are building together.

## Why we did it?

In 2024, catastrophic floods swept through northeastern Bangladesh, submerging villages, destroying homes, and washing away crops and livestock. Thousands of families suddenly found themselves without food, shelter, clean water, or medical care. Children were left without schools, and many families lost the little they owned. With livelihoods shattered and communities in despair, urgent intervention was essential-not only to save lives in the immediate aftermath but also to restore dignity, rebuild homes, and help families stand on their feet again.

## Accomplishment

1,898 families were supported with rescue operations, food relief, medicine, emergency healthcare, education materials, rehabilitation. 260 families were resettled with new homes, tube wells, and latrines, restoring dignity after the disaster.

### Why we did

Poverty strips families not only of financial stability but also of dignity and opportunity. Many hardworking people lack the tools or assets needed to support themselves, leaving them trapped in a cycle of hardship.

P4H's livelihood programs are designed to break this cycle by providing livestock, sewing machines, rickshaws, and small business support. Our aim is to empower families to earn with dignity, achieve selfreliance, and build a better future.

## Accomplishment

Through these two solar-powered RO plants in Satkhira, producing over 12000 liters of clean drinking water daily for 1,500 people from 300 families. Women and children are freed from the burden of walking long distances for water, and the entire community benefits from an eco-friendly, sustainable solution powered by solar energy.

#### Why we did

The coastal areas of Satkhira are among the most climate-vulnerable regions in Bangladesh. Rising sea levels and the intrusion of saline water have created a severe drinking water crisis. Families in these communities are left with no choice but to rely on unsafe, saline-contaminated sources, which cause serious health problems such as skin diseases, high blood pressure, and waterborne illnesses. Women and children often walk long distances to collect even small amounts of potable water, a daily struggle that robs them of time, energy, and dignity.

To address this urgent need, P4H established solar-powered Reverse Osmosis (RO) plants in the Nildumur region of Shyamnagar Upazila, Satkhira.

## Why we did

In the Rohingya refugee camps of Cox's Bazar, thousands of children face the risk of growing up without education, stability, or hope. Overcrowding, poverty, and malnutrition make it difficult for them to learn and thrive.

To address this, P4H established safe schools in Ukhia camps, combining structured learning with nutritional support to help children grow academically and emotionally. Recognizing that host communities also struggle, we operated an Elementary Education Center (Maktub) in Cox's Bazar town, serving 55 vulnerable children. Together, these efforts provide both refugee and host community children with the chance to learn, dream, and build a better future.

#### **Accomplishment**

In 2024, P4H ran three schools in Rohingya camps, reaching 90 children, and an Elementary Education Center in Cox's Bazar town for 55 vulnerable host community children. Along with structured learning, we provided nutritional support, creating safe and inclusive spaces where children could learn, grow, and dream of a brighter future.

#### RAMADAN FOOD BASKET

We distributed 150+ food baskets for the children in the refugee camp in Cox's Bazar. Each basket is designed to sustain a family of four for an entire month, containing essential provisions like rice, lentils, oil, onions, grams, sugar, and other necessities. We also provide them 100 Eid gifts to celebrate Eid happiness with them. The goal was to provide assistance to the vulnerable and economically disadvantaged Rohingya community, particularly during the month of Ramadan.

#### **QURBANI**

On Eid-ul-Azha 2024, we slaughtered 2 cows and 12 goats at the Rohingya Refugee Camp in Cox's Bazar. The most disadvantaged refugee population in the world. With utmost care, we distributed fresh meat to more than 400 families, aiming to bring joy and nourishment to those in need. Our mission was to spread happiness and uplift the spirits of these individuals, especially the chil- dren through the act of Qurbani.
